### Food

**Wherever possible we provide locally sourced, home cooked food for our groups. Meals are planned to be healthy and nutritious.**

**All groups are allocated a meal time and dining room on arrival so that each group eats separately.**

#### We provide:

- Cooked and continental breakfast with cereals, toast, juice, tea and coffee
- A packed lunch
- Hot Evening Meal
- Break time and bed time drinks and snacks

All special diets are catered for. We liaise with each group prior to their stay to ensure that we fully understand the requirements of all members of the group.

Staff eat at the same time as their group. They have their own dining table within the dining room so that they can enjoy their meal whilst still being able to supervise their group.

# living history



## Activity options at Hooke Court, Dorset

**Studying elements of the History National Curriculum for KS2.**

Enjoy these activities individually or as part of one of our excellent value 3 day all-inclusive programmes.

Most of the activities are enjoyed either in the 14th Century Manor House, at the reconstructed Ancient History Settlement or even the authentic World War 1 trench providing a truly unique learning experience.

### Historical Enquirers

#### **Time Team Game**

Use the buildings and artefacts in Hooke Court grounds to develop hypotheses on its development. Play the 'Time Team Game' to see what the experts found.

#### **Dig & Map your own Trench, Clean & Log your Finds**

Work in teams to dig a trench looking for any archaeological finds to map and clean, then identify, date and log them.

### **Building Construction**

Learn about progress in building construction and design through the ages. Work in teams to solve building problems using traditional techniques. Build a hypercaust, a wall using wattle and daub, an aqueduct and an arch strong enough to stand on!

### **Stained Glass (Evening activity)**

Learn about the importance of heraldry and design your own family crest. Paint your design onto a transparency to take home.

### **Clay Pots, Writing with Quills & Wax Seals (Evening activity)**

Enjoy a range of activities creating some mementoes to take home.







## living history (continued)

### First World War Experience

#### Establish Base Camp and Field Kitchen

Cook and sample a typical midday meal that would have been served to the soldiers and carry out some of their training drills including bayonet practice (using wooden poles)!

#### Trench Warfare

Help to construct a World War 1 trench including filling sand bags. Practice the 'Morning Hate' routine as well as 'Over the Top'.

#### Artefacts and Periscopes

Examine World War 1 artefacts and build and use your own periscope.

#### Bovington Tank Museum

Visit the World War 1 exhibition at Bovington Tank Museum and take part in some of their work shops.

### Wartime Evacuees

#### Wartime Cooking & Drills

Cook delicious treats with rations! Learn about wartime drills and shelter from an air raid in our very own bunker!

#### Leaving Home & Living Away. Making Presents for Home

A drama workshop which explores the impact of leaving home to live life as an evacuee. Then, using what items you could have scabbled together, make creative gifts to take home at the end of the evacuation.

#### Letters Home & Wartime Smells!

Visit the schoolroom to write letters home to reassure your parents that all is well. Enjoy a quiz testing your knowledge of the nicer and nastier smells you may have come across in wartime England!

### Off-site Visit

Visit Yeovilton Fleet Air Arm Museum or Bovington Tank Museum.

### Code Breaking (Evening activity)

Test your skills at code breaking.

### VE Day Party & Murder Mystery (Evening activity)

Celebrate the end of the war with your own VE Day Party. After the party solve the 'Whodunnit Mystery' in the grounds of Hooke Court.

### Tudor Traders

#### **Investigation of the Manor and Trade & Travel**

Explore the Manor House, looking for original features and signs of how the building has changed over the years. Learn about trading in Tudor times, form trading companies and design your own logo for your boat.

#### **Tudor Cooking and Pastimes**

Cook Tudor recipes in the Tudor kitchens using spices from your travels abroad. Once the feast is prepared enjoy some time playing Tudor games and making your own candles.

#### **Tudor Crafts & the Schoolroom**

Learn about life as a child in the schoolroom. Write with quills, stamp a wax seal on your letter, weave your own piece of cloth and make pomanders and leather purses to take home.

#### **Costume, Drama & Dance**

Learn all about clothing for the wealthy in Tudor times and try on some of our own Tudor costumes. Learn a Tudor dance or enjoy a drama workshop, choose two out of three options.

#### **Tudor Christmas**

If you are visiting us towards Christmas why not experience it Tudor style. Spend the morning learning about Tudor Christmas customs as well as trying your hand at some Tudor cooking and candle making. Whilst in the school room you will make Christmas pockets, a Christmas kissing bough as well as an invitation to the Twelfth Night Celebration Feast.

#### **Banquet & 'Whodunnit' Mystery at the Court (Evening activity)**

Sit down to a formal Tudor Banquet – some of the children will act as servants and others as entertainers! After dinner investigate a 'Whodunnit' Mystery in the grounds!

**Build a Tudor Boat (Evening activity)** Learn about life as a sailor on board a Tudor vessel and then build your own boat to sail across the moat.

**Mummers Play (Evening activity)** Recreate a traditional Mummers play.

#### **Twelfth Night Feast, Dance and Entertainment (Evening activity)**

Experience a true Tudor Christmas Feast by candle light, and finish the evening with Tudor dancing and entertainment.

### Roman Invaders

#### **Off-site Visit to the Roman Town House & Maiden Castle**

Under the guidance of a Hooke Court tutor, explore the Roman Town House and then go onto Maiden Castle and imagine life in this Iron Age hill fort at the time of the Roman Invasion, complete with a mock attack on the hill fort.

**Transport not included.**

#### **Roman Technology**

Learn about the remarkable achievements of Roman technology. Work in teams to build and test your own onegars, aqueducts and arches.

#### **Cooking, Weaving and Jewellery**

Enjoy cooking a Roman feast, weave some cloth to make your own clothes and create Roman style jewellery.

#### **Clay Pots, Writing and Learning Latin and the Roman Army**

Make clay pots, write in Latin script and finish the session by organising yourselves into a 'testudo' using our shields and stage your own Roman Invasion of Hooke Court!

#### **Life of a Roman Soldier (Evening activity)**

Learn about life in the Roman Army and participate in 'Boot Camp' to find out at first-hand what life was like!

#### **Mosaics (Evening activity)**

Create your own mosaic tile to take home.

### Victorian Servants

#### **Investigating the Manor and Victorian Artefacts**

Start by investigating the manor house looking for evidence of Victorian additions and alterations, and handle genuine artefacts to decide what they are and what they would have been used for.

#### **Cooking, Laundry and Playground Games**

After a thorough inspection from the resident housekeeper, the servants are put through their paces baking cakes for tea in the Victorian kitchen. This is then followed by a spell in the Victorian laundry and some traditional playground games.

#### **Schoolroom, Table Laying and Polishing, Victorian Tea Party**

Experience the rigours of life in a Victorian school and prove your skills as servants in polishing and table laying lessons! Those deemed good enough are chosen to serve tea at the Tea Party.

#### **Victorian Christmas**

Learn about Victorian Christmas traditions including making cornucopia, a christmas card and decorations. Cook some Christmas treats and finish the day singing carols around the tree.

#### **Victorian Crafts (Evening activity)**

Try your hand at the decorative crafts of decoupage and quilling.

#### **Victorian Parlour Games (Evening activity)**

Recreate a Victorian evening in the Parlour including recitations and playing games of the period.



## living history (continued)

### The Anglo Saxons

#### Life in the Saxon Hut

Try your hand at grinding corn, cook some Saxon recipes, followed by some jewellery designing and weaving.

#### Anglo-Saxon Trades

Have a go at writing Saxon runes on clay tiles and help maintain the Saxon hut with some wattle and daub.

#### The Royal Saxon Settlement of Wareham

Under the guidance of a Hooke Court tutor investigate this ancient Saxon Settlement of Wareham.

**Transport not included.**

#### Saxon Saga (Evening activity)

Sit around the open fire next to the Saxon hut and enjoy listening to a story told in the style of a Saxon Saga – be ready for the blood, guts and gore.

### The Celts

#### Maiden Castle

Learn about the Durotriges – our local Celtic tribe and see for yourself where these people would have lived. Experience what it would have been like to have been invaded by the Romans in your very own mock battle.

**Transport not included.**

#### Cooking, Weaving and Grinding

Using traditional methods, cook griddle cakes, bake bread in the bread oven, and prepare and cook pottage with pulses and foraged food over the fire. Grind the wheat for your bread and have a go at weaving some cloth using our traditional weaving frame whilst you wait for lunch to cook.

#### Splitting Wood, Wattle and Daub, Felt Making

Using tools of the era, split logs, maintain the hut with wattle and daub and make some felt using authentic techniques.

#### Dyeing, Jewellery and Clay Pots

Dye some cloth using natural ingredients, design and make your own piece of Celtic jewellery to take away and make your own clay pots drawing inspiration from those of the Celtic era.

#### Tribal Meeting Drama and Celtic Saga around the Fire (Evening activity)

Finish your day with some drama and storytelling around the fire.

#### Celtic Art (Evening activity)

Using the traditional spirals, crosses and knots create your own piece of Celtic art to take away with you.

### Viking Invaders

#### Cooking and Craft Making

Spend some time cooking Viking delicacies, followed by jewellery and leatherwork designing and weaving.

#### Viking Trades

Write some Viking runes on clay tiles, create your own Viking God figure and try your hand at some illuminated writing. Practise wattle and daub on the walls within the Ancient History Settlement and then contribute to your very own class piece to take away.

#### Build a Long Ship

Design and build your very own long ship and test it out on our moat. Also help to make a Viking burial ship to send to Valhalla in the traditional way.

#### Viking Sagas and Poems (Evening activity)

Sit around the fire and enjoy an evening of Viking sagas and poems – a favourite form of entertainment for the people of that time. End the evening with a traditional Viking burial.

### **Build a Temporary Home**

Using a combination of natural and man-made resources, the children work in teams to build a home good enough to sleep in.

### **Igniting a Fire with Natural Materials & Cooking**

Learn about the various ways of igniting a fire. Anyone who is able to light a fire by friction will get their name engraved on the Board of Honour. Use a variety of techniques to prepare and cook food on an open fire.

### **Scavenging and Cooking**

Use a variety of techniques to prepare and cook food on an open fire from a range of ingredients, adding flavour from what you can find in the hedgerows and on the forest floor, dependent on the season.

### **Animal Hunting**

Take a walk to investigate the variety of tracks and signs that can be found, interpreting which animals may have passed by and what they may have been doing.

### **Camp Fire (Evening activity)**

A tutor led activity within which the children can join in with singing songs, telling stories and jokes as well as acting out little sketches. An activity where children can entertain themselves without the use of modern day technology.

### **Foraging and Trapping (Evening activity)**

Take an evening walk to learn about collecting and trapping any potential sources of food in the local woodland.

### **Visit a Local Cheese Factory**

Visit a local Cheese Factory and learn about the cheese making process. Take some cheese back to Hooke Court to use in the cooking of your lunch.

### **Visit the Village Dairy and Trout Farm**

Visit the village trout farm to learn about the life cycle of a trout intended for the plate whilst choosing one to bring back to cook for lunch. Take time to learn about the milking process at our local dairy and collect some milk to use in your cooking.

### **Learn About Hooke Court Animals, Vegetable Plots, Poly Tunnel**

Spend time in our poly tunnel and on our vegetable beds learning about the food we are growing and help to plant, maintain and harvest as well as gain an understanding of composting. Take a walk around our animals on site and learn about their breed, husbandry and care.

### **Kneading, Rubbing and Crumbling**

Spend half a day making bread, pastry and crumble mixtures and learn to use them to make a healthy and nutritious meal.

### **Sauce and Soup Investigation**

### **Beaminster**

3.5 miles away.  
Attractive local town.

### **Mapperton Manor House**

Tudor Manor House is 2 miles from Hooke Court along a bridle way and is the present home of the Earl of Sandwich.

### **Golden Cap Estate**

Golden Cap, just west of Bridport, is the highest cliff on the south coast of England. The walks and views are magnificent.

### **Charmouth and Lyme Regis**

Covers 20 acres of natural woodland and has many rare and record breaking plants and trees.
